About the name of the USS Caperton

The USS Caperton was named after Admiral William Banks Caperton (1855 - 1941). A graduate of the United States Naval Academy in 1875, he advanced to the rank of Admiral in 1919. His distinguished career included command of the Atlantic Reserve Fleet and representing the U.S. as an Ambassador in South America.
